Learn to Save Transportation Dollars for your District

This session is about helping you see and understand the transportation savings your District can achieve through the application of process improvement techniques.

In the last two years, The Kentucky Center for Performance Excellence, Inc. (KyCPE) has lead two coaching engagements involving school transportation systems. The first engagement resulted from a PIPE grant to Lawrence County Schools (KY) in the 2015-2016 school year. That project resulted in five-year savings of \$209,500.

The second engagement, during the 2016-2017 school year, was a KyCPE cooperative project with Warren County Public Schools (KY), a District that was already esteemed for its transportation

management. The purpose of the project was to refine KyCPE's ability to deliver school transportation savings. The result of this project is projected 12-year savings for <u>one school</u> of \$540,000. Warren County has 27 schools is – there is much work left to be done.
